NORTH BY NORTHWEST WILL CONTINUE FILMING IN SPOKANE SATURDAY, JULY 25

- 4 a.m. to 10 p.m., Erie Street between Front Avenue and 1st Avenue.
 North Sprague Way and North Sprague Access will be closed.
- Between 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. East Sprague Avenue from Madelia Street to Crestline Street will have a three hour closure. Madelia Street from East Sprague to East Riverside Avenue will be closed from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- <u>SOUTH PERRY STREET FAIR AND PARADE</u> SATURDAY, JULY 25 Perry Street will be closed from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. between 9th and 11th Avenue, detour routes will be set up. Additional street closures will take place during the parade starting at 10:00 a.m.

OBSTRUCTION UPDATE

UNDERHILL COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 34-2 TANK CONTINUES

Freya Street will be closed from Hartson Street to 29th Avenue through the end of August.

Utility work and road reconstruction on Freya Street from 8th Ave. to 9th Ave. is underway. Local access will be restricted. This project constructed a combined sewer overflow facility under the parking lot at Underhill Park.

The \$7.7 million project is being paid for by the Water-Wastewater Integrated Capital Fund.

 <u>CSO 6, CONTROL FACILITY AND INTEGRATED INTERCEPTOR, FROM</u> <u>KIERNAN AVENUE TO NORTHWEST BOULEVARD CONTINUES</u> Columbia from Downriver Drive to H Street and H Street from Columbia to Northwest Blvd is closed to thru traffic.

The project includes the installation of a 900,000 gallon tank. New water mains will be added at H Street, Glass Avenue and Columbia Circle these lines will be connected to the new main along Columbia Circle. Columbia Circle, H Street and Glass Avenue will be repaved and sidewalk repairs will happen in select areas. Many driveways will be replaced to match the new street grade. This week construction includes

- o Installing bypass piping
- o Chuck and haul off asphalt around Columbia Circle
- Excavate for inspector vault

The 9.5 million project is being paid for by the Water – Wastewater Integrated Capital Fund

 <u>CSO 20/24 HIGH DRIVE & HATCH ROAD CONTINUES WITH MAJOR WORK</u> <u>BEGINNING IN 43RD AVENUE</u>

Monday, July 27, 43rd Street from Grand to Scott will be closed. 43rd Ave. from Grand to Garfield St. will be closed to thru traffic until late September. Thru traffic is advised to use the Perry Street detour.

This project will construct a storage facility for CSO Basin 20, with connecting piping, interceptor inlet vault, flush systems, regulator and controls at 43rd Avenue and Garfield Street.

This work is part of the Combined Sewer Overflow program for a Cleaner River Faster Integrated Approach to Street Repair.

This project is funded with Wastewater funds, Federal and Local funds

THE RESIDENTIAL CHIP SEAL PROGRAM HAS STARTED

The project will be in three different district locations. District one, Regal Street from Rowan Avenue to Francis Avenue; District two, 33rd Avenue to 36th Avenue from Grand Boulevard to Perry Street; and, District three, Elm Street from Broadway Avenue to Boone Avenue.

Chip sealing will consist of one-fourth chip repairs and a fog seal. This project also includes minor pavement repair and crack sealing.

This \$576,000 project is being funded with Transportation Benefit District funds.

• <u>Francis Avenue – Division to East City Limits ITS Devices &</u> <u>Communication Infrastructure</u>

This project calls for installation of Variable Message Signs, Closed Circuit TV systems, fiber optic cables, and other related miscellaneous items. Motorist will see intermittent lane closures for the duration of the project.

This \$650,000 project is being funded with Federal and Local funds

URBAN OUTFITTERS

 Walker Construction has set up construction fencing around 702 W Main. The fencing is scheduled to be up until demolition and construction of Urban Outfitters is complete in late June of 2016.

OTHER OBSTRUCTION CLOSURES

- CenturyLink is working on a leak locate, closing the western southbound lane on Grand north of 24th Ave. until Friday, July 24.
- J & J Construction will be doing asphalt patch replacement, closing the alley south of Main between Browne and Division on Friday, July 24.
- J & J Construction will be repairing an existing manhole on the north side of 9th Avenue and Grand from Thursday, July 23 to Monday, July 27, flaggers will be on site.
- Northwest Excavators are installing new water and sewer taps, closing 14th Avenue between Conklin and Garfield until Tuesday, July 28.
- Vietzke will be working on sewer line relay and repair, closing 8th Ave between Oak and Elm until Tuesday, July 28.
- Piersol Construction continues working on new utilities, swales and street improvements, Cook between Springfield and Broadway is closed until Wednesday, July 29.
- Palouse Highway will be closed for a County road project approximately from Thor St to Windmill Drive until Tuesday, August 4.
- Inland Asphalt will be closing Ivory from Plateau to Rockwood Pines for street realignment until Monday, August 17.

- Baker Construction will be closing the sidewalk on the eastern side of Division from Mission to Augusta, with a hard closure from Mission to the Alley, and a soft closure from alley north to Augusta. Alley closure as needed. This closure will end Tuesday, August 18.
- Garco is continuing their 100% closure of Madison from 3rd Ave. to Freeway Ave until Monday, August 31.
- Terra Bella will be closing the northern lane of Spokane Falls Blvd west of northbound Division until Sunday, September 20. They will be working on the right-of-way triangle.
- Avista has begun pulling wire in manholes in the downtown area, affecting 1st
 Avenue and Wall Street.

 PHASE II OF HIGH DRIVE, BERNARD STREET TO GRAND BOULEVARD CONTINUES

The road is closed from Bernard Street to Grand Boulevard with local access only. Storm and sewer work is underway.

This integrated project includes pavement reconstruction, storm, sewer, 208 swales, and water main replacement from Bernard Street to Grand Boulevard. Phase Two construction is expected last through the fall.

The \$5 million project is being funded with Federal funds and various City funds, including the 10-Year Street Bond

• <u>I 90 DIVISION GATEWAY, 4TH TO 3RD AVENUE IS ON HOLD AWAITING DELIVERY OF REMAINING MATERIALS</u>

This project is for beautification improvements to five highly visible locations at the I90 and Division Street gateway entrances to the City.

This \$597,602 project is being funded with parking dollars

• <u>MONROE/LINCOLN STREET COUPLET, 8TH AVENUE TO 2ND AVENUE WILL</u> <u>BEGIN IN EARLY AUGUST</u>

The project includes reconstruction of the street from 8th Ave. - Main Ave. and will replace the asphalt surfacing, including ADA ramps as needed.

The \$4.52 million project is being funded by the 10-Year Street Bond, Capital Programs, Storm Water Improvements, and Water Department

• <u>HAVANA STREET IMPROVEMENTS FROM GLENROSE ROAD TO 37TH</u> <u>AVENUE CONTINUES</u>

Glenrose Road from 57th Avenue to Havana Street is closed to thru traffic. Work has begun at the intersection of Freya and 44th with traffic and pedestrian improvements. Traffic will be impacted on both streets and will be controlled by flaggers and signs.

Improvements include full width pavement replacement, complete sidewalk gaps and pilot project porous asphalt bicycle lanes. This project will also include installation of a 36 inch water transmission main between 37th Avenue and the Brown Park reservoirs at 57th Avenue.

The \$3.7 million project is funded with Local and State DWSRF funds

<u>PHASE I OF ROWAN AVENUE IMPROVEMENTS FROM DRISCOLL</u> BOULEVARD TO MONROE STREET WILL BEGIN LATE SUMMER

This project includes reconstruction of the street from Driscoll Blvd. to Monroe Street. The project also includes installation of bike lanes, filling sidewalk gaps and replacing water lanes.

The \$2.7 million project is a City funded project

HARTSON AVENUE FROM ALTAMONT STREET TO FISKE STREET WILL BEGIN IN AUGUST

This project includes full depth roadway section of traveled way, fill sidewalk gaps, replace curbing where needed and install ADA curb ramps. The project will also include replacement of water lines.

The \$830,000 project is being funded with City Wastewater and Water funds

PHASE I OF INDIANA AVENUE FROM DIVISION STREET TO PERRY STREET

Monday, July 27 Indiana will be closed to thru traffic from Division to Dakota.

This project will include full depth roadway replacement and change lane configuration to one lane each direction with bike lanes.

The \$2.0 million project is being funded by the City

• <u>PHASE I OF RAY/THOR STREET FROM 29TH AVENUE TO 3RD AVENUE WILL</u> <u>BEGIN THIS SUMMER</u> Improvements include the use of preservation treatments that include crack sealing, find and overlay and pavement rejuvenation techniques. Pedestrian improvements include upgrades to ADA curb ramps and minor curb and sidewalk repairs.

The \$687,000 project is funded by the Federal Surface Transportation Program

US 2/DEER ROAD TO WESTWOOD ROAD

WSDOT crews will patch wheel ruts Monday July 27- Tuesday, July 28 with intermittent lane closures. Motorists should expect delays the hours of 6:00am-5:00pm.

• SR 206/ BRUCE ROAD TO MT. SPOKANE STATE PARK GATE (MP 3-15)

This project includes pavement repair, shoulder work, pre-level paving and chip seal. Drivers should be alert for long delays with flaggers and/or pilot cars directing single-lane, alternating traffic. When loose gravel is present on the roadway, the legal speed limit will be reduced to 35 mph. Drivers should be alert for speed limit signage.

US 195-SOUTHBOUND/I-90 TO ECVELSIOR ROAD (MP 95-87)

This project includes concrete pavement rehabilitation and multiple pavement panel replacements. Drivers should be alert for southbound US 195 reduced to one through lane in multiple work areas with possible slower traffic. Panel replacements require long curing time with lane restrictions 24 hours a day.

 <u>NSC/BNSF Railway Structures/Realignment & Ped/Bike Trail Extension</u> WSDOT crews will construct two freeway mainline bridges over the BNSF tracks and two pedestrian bridges, realign BNSF mainline and spur tracks and extend Children of the Sun Trail into the Hillyard area. Short, intermittent delays with flaggers directing traffic at pedestrian bridge.

• <u>SR 290-TRENT AVENUE /SULLIVAN ROAD TO IDAHO STATE LINE</u> (MP 10-18)

Asphalt paving on Trent Avenue/SR 290 plus paving and utility work Sullivan Road and Wellesley Avenue. Drivers should be alert for daytime lane restrictions between Sullivan Road and Wellesley Ave. In addition, drivers should watch for lane restrictions on Sullivan Road between Trent and Wellesley.

• SR 27-PINES ROAD/BNSF CROSSING REPAIR (MP 87)

BNSF and WSDOT railroad crossing repairs. On Wednesday, July 29 and Thursday, July 30, SR 27/Pines road at the BNSF mainline crossing at Trent will be closed. Signed detours will be available.

US 2/395-DIVISION STREET/FRANCIS AVENUE TO FARWELL ROAD

Sunday August 2 through Wednesday August 5th WSDOT crews will be *night paving* to repair wheel ruts on Division from Francis Ave. to the "Y" and US 2/ the "Y" to Farwell Rd. Work will begin at 7:00 p.m. each night and end at 5:30 a.m. the following day. Traffic will be reduced to one lane the direction of work with occasional side road closures while the crew is working in that area.

TRAFFIC CALMING AND SIDEWALK

<u>2015 ARTERIAL CURB RAMP PROJECTS CONTINUE</u>

This project calls for Installation of ADA-compliant curb ramps at each intersection corner ahead of the City of Spokane scheduled street maintenance grind and overlay projects. This project is funded with local funds.

- Mission Ave. from Calispel Street to Atlantic Street will be finishing up this week.
- Work will begin on Wellesley Ave. from Mayfair St. to Cincinnati Street this week.

The construction estimate for this project is \$350,000

• CONNECT TO TRANSIT, PHASE II, CITYWIDE CONTINUES

New ADA approved curb ramps will be installed on Sinto from Pearl to Cincinnati this week. There will be no lane closures.

This federally funded project consists of the construction of ADA accessible curb ramps, sidewalk, pavement patching, utility adjustments, and other related items.

This \$ 383,775 project is being funded with Federal Transportation Administration funds

• TRAFFIC CALMING PROJECTS ARE SUBSTANTIALLY COMPLETE

This project will construct crosswalks, sidewalks, curb ramps, and place signage around the city.

Sidewalk and ADA work on:

- Walnut and 7th Avenue curb bump outs are being installed. There will be lane restrictions from 8th Avenue to 7th Avenue
- o Jackson Street from Perry to Columbus, asphalt patching is finishing
- Bernard Street From 29th to 31st sidewalk installation is occurring
- Rockwood and upper Terrace at Arthur a walk through Island is being installed
- o 17th Avenue from Fiske to Martin has begun

The construction estimate for this project is between \$500,000 and \$800,000.

DOWNTOWN PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS WILL BEGIN 2015

This project will design and construct pedestrian improvement in the Downtown Core consisting primarily of structural sidewalk repair/replacement. The project also includes minor sidewalk repair, street tree infill, and replacement of hazardous street tree grates and installation of bike racks, planters and garbage cans.

This \$1.4 million project is being funded with Federal, State and Local funds

TRAIL/PATH

 ADDISON/STANDARD BICYCLE/PEDESTRIAN CORRIDOR FROM BUCKEYE TO HOLLAND WILL BEGIN 2015

This project will complete a major bicycle and pedestrian corridor. It will install missing bike lanes and sidewalks along the entire corridor and make improvements to existing bike lanes.

This project is being funded with Federal funds

EAST SPRAGUE AVENUE CSO BASIN 33-2 CONTROL FACILITY

This project will construct a combined sewer overflow facility on City property across from the City's Sewer Maintenance Facility. One lane will be open in each direction on E. Sprague from Scott Street to the Hamilton Overpass.

The \$3.7 million project is being paid for by the Water-Wastewater Integrated Capital Fund.

• <u>GARDEN PARK BOOSTER STATION REHABILITATION AT 2403 EAST 37TH</u> <u>SUSPENDED</u>

This project is to rehabilitate the existing booster station with a new building, pumps, and motors. **37TH Avenue between Cook Street and Crestline is now open.** This work is for installation of a new transmission main and connection to the new Booster Station.

The \$500,000 project is being funded by City funds

PANORAMA DRIVE WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT

The road closure will remain with local access only. The water main installation on Maple Street and Cascade Way is complete and road reconstruction is now in progress. Both Maple St. and Cascade Way are closed with local access only.

The construction estimate for this project is \$965,000.

STREET DEPARTMENT WORK

GRIND AND OVERLAY WORK IS UNDERWAY

Paving will be finished Tuesday, July 28 on NW Boulevard from C Street to Lindeke. There will be lane closures keeping one lane open in each direction.

Tuesday, July 28 work will start on Mission between Washington and Division, **use Indiana or Boone as your detour route.**

Grind and overlay projects will begin in September on Marietta Avenue between Freya Street and Myrtle Street. Also, work on 32nd Avenue between Regal Street and Ray Street. These projects include the installation of ADA ramps.
