Sidewalk Questionnaire Please submit if You have not submitted last meeting –Previous Submissions turned into PeTT Committee

Should the city council and the mayor's administration commit time and resources in an attempt to develop a comprehensive sidewalk program to assure that sidewalks over the entire city are repaired according to deficiencies in their condition, and that sidewalk gaps are filled in -- for example, walking routes to transit stops and key locations within pedestrian priority areas documented by the city's recently adopted pedestrian plan – all with the understanding that such a program would require additional fees or taxes for property owners.

- (1) This idea is not meant as a substitute for, or a delay of, the ongoing effort to provide a mechanism using discretionary city resources to support property owners with limited means to repair their sidewalks when subject to a code violation.
- (2) In general a citywide program would recognize the shared responsibility of property owners and the city itself for safe sidewalks and equity in pedestrian mobility.
- (3) As in previous citywide street improvement projects, such a program would involve in all likelihood a limited term of years and a citizen advisory body to establish priorities and determine the annual sequence of repairs and infill.



A RESOLUTION recognizing the attached South Hill Coalition Connectivity and Livability Strategic Plan as a declaration of the coalition's desired future condition, providing direction for neighborhood based-improvement activities as well as neighborhood priorities involving future projects.

WHEREAS, the City of Spokane ("City") officially recognizes individual neighborhoods through the City's Neighborhood Council and Community Assembly process; and

WHEREAS, Spokane's City Council allocated \$550,000 in funding towards Neighborhood Planning in 2007; and

WHEREAS, these funds were divided twenty-six (26) ways with each neighborhood receiving approximately \$21,150, with the exception of the Riverside Neighborhood Council, which opted out of the process; and

WHEREAS, the Cliff Cannon, Comstock, Lincoln Heights, Manito/Cannon Hill, and Rockwood neighborhoods implemented a combined planning process in 2012 with their formation of the South Hill Coalition ("SHC") to address common neighborhood issues; and

WHEREAS, the SHC established a Steering Committee, comprised of leaders from all five (5) neighborhoods, to organize and lead the planning process; and

WHEREAS, the vision of the South Hill Coalition Connectivity and Livability Strategic Plan is to ensure that "the South Hill neighborhoods, streets, parks, and community destinations are safe, livable, well-connected and contribute to healthy communities and a high quality of life for residents and visitors of all ages and abilities," and

WHEREAS, the South Hill Coalition Connectivity and Livability Strategic Plan contains a significant body of work detailing the coalition's existing conditions, opportunities, and an outline for possible action designed to develop a vibrant, healthy, active, and better connected community; and

WHEREAS, the South Hill Coalition Connectivity and Livability Strategic Plan creates a visionary document to help guide the neighborhood into the future; and

WHEREAS, the SHC Steering Committee conducted an early, continuous, and

Coalition Connectivity and Livability Strategic Plan) designed to encourage all stakeholders within the coalition's five (5) neighborhoods to engage in the two-year planning process; and

WHEREAS, the SHC Steering Committee held nearly forty (40) steering committee meetings; mailed and electronically posted notices of upcoming open houses and workshops to residents, land owners, and business owners; held six (6) public stakeholder open house workshops to gather input and comments; conducted on-line and mailer surveys; presented plan overviews at town hall council meetings, neighborhood council meetings, and social events; and created a SHC website to enable public understanding and participation; and

WHEREAS, the South Hill Coalition Connectivity and Livability Strategic Plan does not direct nor commit City resources for action or project implementation, but does document the desires of the five (5) coalition neighborhoods for City decision-makers as they consider future funding and implementation measures for City plans and projects; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2014, the Plan Commission voted unanimously (7-0) to recommend to the City Council that the Plan be adopted by resolution; and

WHEREAS, as prescribed in SMC 04.12.010, this resolution does not represent a recommendation of the Plan Commission regarding a legislative action to adopt changes to the Spokane Municipal Code or the text or maps of the Comprehensive Plan; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL that the South Hill Coalition Connectivity and Livability Strategic Plan is recognized as a guide for future neighborhood-based improvement activities in the Cliff Cannon, Comstock, Lincoln Heights, Manito/Cannon Hill, and Rockwood neighborhoods and is recognized as a written record of the South Hill Coalition's ongoing desire and efforts to continue building vibrant, healthy, active, safe and connected neighborhoods for all South Hill Coalition residents.

ORIGINAL TRAFFIC CALMING REQUEST

The proposed project is to conduct a traffic and access study in order to analyze the reconfiguration of Grand Blvd between 29th Ave. and 32nd Ave. The results of the traffic and access study may lead to a restriping pilot project similar to the re-striping on East Sprague.

FINAL PROJECT DECISION

Estimated Cost: 86,180

The City Council has chosen not to fund this project in the cycle year but would like to work with the neighborhood council to figure out a scope for a study so that an actual cost can be put on a study around the Manito Shopping Center and Sacajawea that would spell out improvements for pedestrian safety. This project is a priority for excess traffic calming funds or next year's funding cycle for traffic calming.

TRAFFIC CALMING DEVICE OR TREATMENT REQUESTED:

The traffic and access study would consider reducing the number of traffic lanes from a 5-lane street section to a 3-lane street section beginning at 30th Ave. and continuing south. The study would also consider:

1) Marked crosswalks with pedestrian refuge island at 30th, 31st, 32nd Ave.

2) On street parking on Grand Blvd between curb cuts

 The potential relocation of curb cuts to accommodate crosswalks/pedestrian refuge medians and on-street parking.

 Consultation and coordination with businesses, property owners and Spokane Public Schools in order to maintain and improve access to their properties within the Grand District Center.
