How to research Permits in Spokane- Brief lesson on find out what is proposed in your neighborhood- Using an example of a recent permit application in Comstock Neighborhood-

How to view a Permit Application

Step 1- Go to https://my.spokanecity.org

Step 2 Scroll down and click on "Services"

Step 3 Click on "Online Permitting"

Step 4 Click on the tab that says "Building"

Step 5 Enter the address of the building about where you see permit information

Step 6 Example 3103 S Grand Blvd

Fill in the address with the street number (3103), the direction (S) the Street(Grand) the street type (Blvd)

Step 7 Click on Search and if there are records they will appear

Step 8 In this example click on Predevelopment Conference

Step 9 Scroll down and then Click on the arrow by "Attachments"

Step 10 Go to "View People Attachments" and find out what is applied, plans, and other documents

You can do this for any address in the city of Spokane to view a permit application for that address.
