### Commenting

- READ and provide comments on the proposal and on the SEPA environmental checklist/supplement comment period.
- Comment throughout the process; to Planning, Plan Commission, and City Council. Watch for comment periods and hearing notices. Establish "standing."
- Facts carry more weight and are more useful to decision makers than opinions.

# Commenting (cont.)

- Studies would be one source for supporting comments. Ask
   Planning for any study documents on file.
- Comprehensive plan designation, goals, objectives, and policies for the property and area.
- Other planning documents for the area, such as a neighborhood plan (after 2001).
- Look up the zoning category in SMC 17C and become familiar with the permitted and non permitted uses.

# Commenting (cont.)

- Focus on the facts! Of course, share history, opinion, likes or dislikes, but keep in mind decision-makers must make a decision based on how well the facts measure up with the criteria found in the SMC.
- Public comment is the chance to provide facts that reveal whether a proposal meets the criteria, to communicate local neighborhood conditions to an applicant that may not be understood, and to shape a better project.

- Comment and Testify! Written comment is most useful when it is factual and addresses the Decision Criteria or items discussed in the SEPA Checklist.
