Report from Ty Schneider – Detective for Spokane Police Department

- It was reported at the last meeting by CP Kinnear that the money for further Traffic Officer positions was being held up by negotiations with the Police Guild. This was incorrect. The money was actually used for other purposes.

TRAFFIC CALMING

HIGHDRIVE

High Drive was re-done with the hope of calming traffic. The result has been that traffic speeds have increased. A Comstock Neighborhood Council resolution was proposed.

<u>Councilperson Beggs stated that if all 3 neighborhoods (Comstock, Manito, Cliff Cannon) agree,</u> the city can move forward with lowering the speeds on High Drive.

John Schram read the resolution to those present. Motion made to approve the resolution and seconded. MOTION PASSED, Approve – 8, Oppose – 4.

JEFFERSON

We are working on getting the sidewalks completed on Bernard from 37th to High Drive. We have received a letter in support of the sidewalk completion from Jefferson Elementary. This will support seeking funds from the school red light funds.

MASTER COMPOSTER

Erica Dellwo from the Master composters spoke. The goal is to keep paper out of the recycling that cannot absorb water i.e. wax coated milk cartons, plastic coated items. Paper must be larger than a 3 x 5 card. No paper towels, tissues, tissue paper – the fibers are too short.

Tours are offered at the recycling center with prior arrangement.

There are no longer any markets for recycled materials unless they are very clean.
