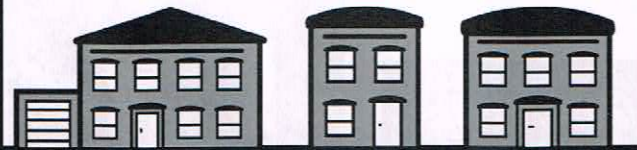

2019 YEAR- END REPORT

Lime Bike and Scooter 2019 Year-End Report

Spokane's Wheel Share program, operated by Lime, ran for seven months in 2019, from May to November. During this time, the City and Lime worked together with local partners to support public safety while providing new transportation options for getting around Spokane. Through mid-November, riders logged 643,000 miles and 581,000 individual trips on the shared bicycles and scooters. 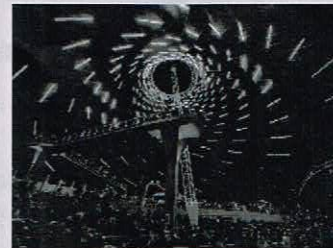
