



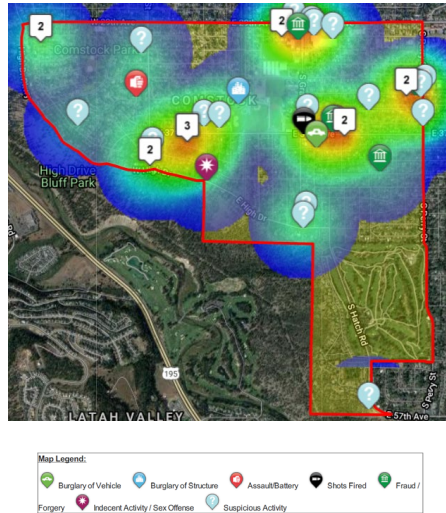
# Comstock Neighborhood Council Meeting 4-21-21

## Crime Trends:

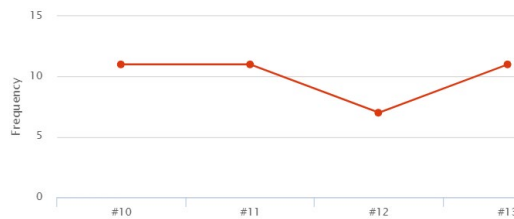
As of last week violent crime is up 18.37% and property crime is down 17.50% year to date city wide.

Crime in the entire P7 district, which includes West Hills, Grandview/Thorpe, Latah/Hangman, Browne's Addition, Peaceful Valley, Cliff/Cannon, Manito and Comstock neighborhoods is up for violent crime 34.20% and property crime is down 20.69% year to date.

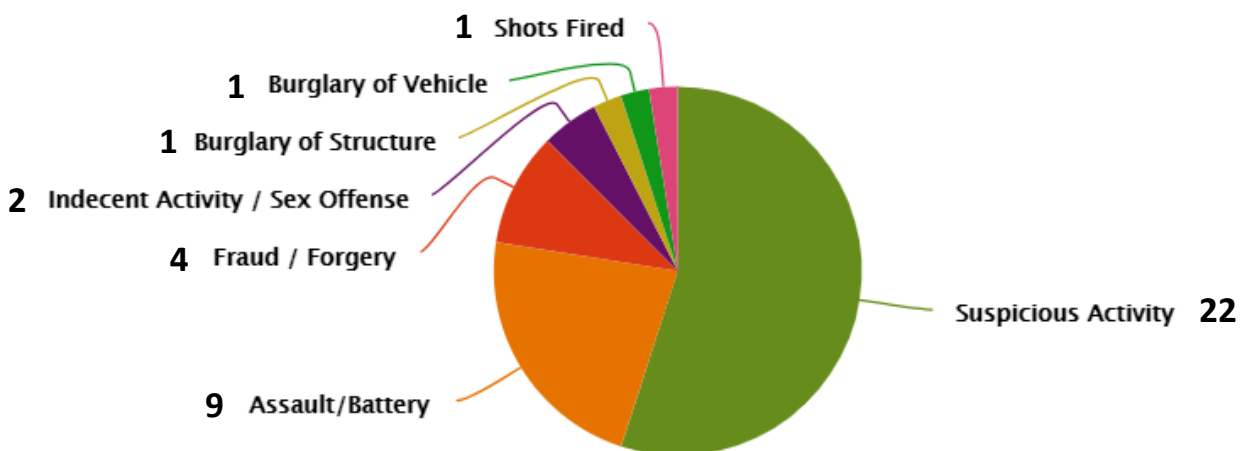
The heat map of Comstock shows the criminal activity concentration over the last month. The area near 37<sup>th</sup>/Grand is seeing the most activity.



Calls For Service are on a decline for last month with a spike to 11 in weeks 10, 11 and 13 of the year.

## Crime Check

Crime Check is a service provided by Spokane County 911 for non-emergency calls. Crime Check will process reports for some local law enforcement agencies as determined by those agencies.

Please refer to the information below for tips when calling and how to determine whether to call Crime Check at 509-456-2233 or the emergency call receivers at 911.

## Tips for Calling

- Know where you are and your telephone number.
- Stay calm.
- Answer the Call Receivers questions and stay on the line until the Call Receiver is finished obtaining the necessary information.
- If you are unsure you have an emergency, dial 911 and let the communications center decide what action is necessary.
- Do not call 911 for information. Refer to your telephone book or call your phone provider for directory assistance.

## When to call 911?

- If you are the victim of a crime that is in progress or just occurred.
- If you are witnessing a crime that is in progress or just occurred.
- If you are the victim of a crime and the suspect is still in the area.
- If you have a need to immediate police response to a crime.
- If you need to report a fire.
- If there is a medical emergency.
- If you need the Fire Department for a rescue or if you are trapped.

## When to call Crime Check?

- To file a police report over the phone for a crime that is no longer occurring.
- If you witnessed a crime that previously occurred.
- If you have information about a past crime.
- To add information on a previous crime report.
- If you are the victim of a crime that is not in progress.
- To report a crime after the fact which does not require an officer/deputy at the scene.

- Solid Waste Collection with residential garbage services: if you need to change your cart size, want to add yard waste, or want to know if that plastic jug is recyclable.
- Register for a Parks and Recreation class.
- Report a pothole or other road hazard: we take calls for Streets so they can focus on dispatching crews to fix the problem.
- Code and Parking Enforcement needs: If you need to report a parking violation, some graffiti, or an illegal garbage dump such as discarded needles, we will take your information and get a case started.
